This proposed Order also introduces a 50 MPH Speed Limit on Ancren Close.

The second proposed Order amends the Traffic Regulation Order enacting parking restrictions in Ferring to match the current layout of double yellow lines near the shops at the junction of Ferringham Lane and Ocean Drive.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSING TO MAKE THE ORDERS

West Sussex County Council proposes to make two permanent Traffic Regulation Orders. The first of the proposed Orders would introduce 30 mph speed limits on the roads of Ferring, as listed in the attached public notice and shown on the attached drawing, numbered JEA1002.

The majority of roads in Ferring are privately owned and are maintained on behalf of local residents by the Ferring Roads Scheme Association (FRSA). Although they are privately owned, public highway rights apply to these roads. As such West Sussex County Council, as the Highway Authority, is responsible for setting any restrictions applied to them.

An Order enacting a 30 mph speed limit in South Ferring was made in 1937. At some point, believed to be in the early 1990s, 20 mph road markings were installed throughout the private estate roads. These markings did not comply with the legislation on traffic signs and conflicted with the 30 MPH speed limit Order. This situation had the unfortunate effect of invalidating the speed limits, thereby preventing Sussex Police from taking any action to prosecute motorists driving too quickly in the area.

In practice, for many years this issue caused very few problems, but more recently concerns have been raised about speeding traffic in the area. In response, the Joint Eastern Arun County Local Committee prioritised a project to re-introduce legally enforceable speed limits in Ferring, with the FRSA amending its signage to comply with national legislation.

Initially it was intended to make a new Traffic Regulation Order for a 20 MPH speed limit but speed survey results identified that average traffic speeds on some roads were too high to meet policy on the setting of appropriate speed limits. Consideration was given to applying a 30 mph speed limit on the roads with higher speeds and a 20 mph limit on the remainder, but the traffic sign regulations are such that taking this approach would require a very large number of unsightly traffic signs. It was felt that this would be aesthetically unacceptable given the nature of the area and that applying a blanket 30 mph speed limit, which requires far fewer signs, was the most appropriate way to proceed.

Alongside this project, it is proposed to introduce a 50 MPH speed limit on Ancren Close. This road is not presently included in a speed limit order at all and because it has no street lighting the national 60 mph speed limit applies. As such it should presently have 'national speed limit' signs at its junction with the A259, but no signs are in place, which is technically unlawful. Matching the speed limit on Ancren Close to the 50 MPH speed limit on the A259 will resolve this problem without requiring any additional signs.

The second proposed Traffic Regulation Order amends the Order enacting parking restrictions in Ferring so that it matches a revised layout of double yellow lines now installed near the shops at the junction of Ferringham Lane and Ocean Drive. This Order makes no changes to the layout of the present lines at this location.

The new Orders are therefore proposed to avoid the risk of danger to persons or traffic using the affected lengths of roads and to improve the amenities of the area through which the affected lengths of roads run.

The attached drawing, titled JEA1002 shows the lengths of roads affected by the proposed speed limit Order. Drawing numbers TQ0902SWS and TQ0901NWN show the lengths of roads affected by the proposed parking restrictions Order.

West Sussex County Council in exercise of their powers under Section 84 (1) a of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act"), and after consultation with the chief officer of police in accordance with Part III and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on the ***** day of ****** and may be cited as "West Sussex County Council (Ferring: Various Roads) (30 MPH & 50 MPH Speed Limits) Order 2016"
- 2. The Parts of Orders specified in the First Schedule to this Order are hereby revoked.
- 3. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour in the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this Order.
- 4. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the length of road specified in the Third Schedule to this Order.
- 5. Nothing in Paragraphs 3 or 4 shall apply to a vehicle being used by naval, military or air force purposes while being driven by a person for the timebeing subject to the orders of a member of the armed forces of the Crown on an occasion when –

(a) the person driving the vehicle is a member of the special forces as defined by the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011; and

(b) the vehicle is being driven-

(i) in response, or for practice in responding, to a national security emergency by a person who has been trained in driving vehicles at high speeds; or

(ii) for the purpose of training a person in driving vehicles at high speeds.
