The gentleman who lives alongside advised me that he had fixed the FRSA sign to his fence, being 'fed up' with it being thrown into his garden. I thanked him for his involvement, and apologised that he had been inconvenienced.

On my return from holiday, in a couple of week's time, I shall purchase a couple of new barrel planters. One for the Highdown site, which I presume remained with Ferring Nurseries when we requested that the winter planting should not proceed. The other as a replacement for the barrel at Langbury Lane which is 'on it's last legs'.
